



Unto the Breach 2014 Muscat Canelli Sustainably Farmed

Winemaker Chris Christensen's Notes:

Dry. D-R-Y. Yes Dry, Muscat Canelli. For those serious drinkers who are afraid to admit they like bright and fruit-forward wines here's one right up your alley. It's fresh fruit in a glass; peach cobbler with alcohol. But don't get it twisted: this isn't your basic grocery store Moscato. With grapes grown at a single vineyard, hand harvested with care under the supervision of the winemaker (who made the drive up to Lake County at 1:00 am on the night of harvest), this wine was crafted, styled and blended with one goal in mind: make a Muscat that does the variety justice. This is a wine for the grown and sexy, the aristocratic and the cultured. But seeing as how we are here at Bodkin wines doesn't fit that description either, we will let anybody over the age of 21 buy it. And odds are you're going to like it. Trust me.

We decided to call this wine "Unto the Breach" in homage to Shakespeare's telling of the tumultuous English siege of the French city of Harfleur in the play Henry V.
